## OUR COMMUNITY RESPONSE PLAN

When a natural disaster hits, our community may need to take care of itself for up to three to five days before help can arrive. This Community Response Plan has been developed to ensure there are measures in place to help our community look after itself if a natural hazard results in isolation or there is a delay in receiving Civil Defence support.

### Context

Thames Coromandel District Council (TCDC) encourages communities and volunteer groups to have plans to provide immediate welfare support that do not rely on help from outside emergency services or Civil Defence Emergency Management (CDEM) for up to 3 days.

This Community Response Plan has been developed by and for the Onemana Community Response Group (CRG) and is made up of members who bring local knowledge, skills and resources in a voluntary capacity to support the welfare of the Onemana community following an emergency. The Onemana Community Response Plan covers the Onemana Bay Settlement

The plan guides the effective delivery of welfare services recognising that community-based entities may establish and offer welfare support to the community impacted by emergencies.

CDEM Groups are responsible for the coordination of arrangements but rely on groups like the CRG for the local delivery of welfare services. Activation of this plan may negate the need for the set-up of a formal Civil Defence Centre by CDEM. This plan aligns with and complements CDEM arrangements.

### Purpose

- Help us to understand the hazards that exist in our community
- Let us know what level of risk these hazards pose to our community
- Ensure residents know the warning signals to evacuate, and where to evacuate to
- Help residents know what they can do to prepare themselves, and their dependants, to survive through an emergency
- Help our community to put the response plan into action without any immediate help from emergency services or Civil Defence
- Support and assist the emergency services when requested.

### Ownership

This community-driven response plan is owned and developed by our community.

The plan is developed by representatives of stakeholder agencies (i.e. Council) and volunteer members within our community, who form a working group with the goal of completing and maintaining the plan. The process of developing the plan was facilitated by an Emergency Management Officer from the Thames Coromandel District Council.

Sign off and ownership of the plan stays with the community, represented by the Community Response Group.

## Roles and responsibilities

<p>Civil Defence Emergency Management - CDEM</p>	<p>When emergencies strike we all become Civil Defence. Civil Defence Professionals support NZ’s frontline emergency services with severe weather, natural disasters or searching for missing persons; providing casualty, rescue, auxiliary fire brigade, welfare, monitoring and communications services.</p> <p>These services are delivered locally through local authorities (e.g. Thames Coromandel District Council). Each local authority has a Civil Defence Officer who oversees the organising and recruitment of volunteers; and acts as the link between the volunteer, community, local authority and Civil Defence nationally.</p> <p>When a natural disaster has occurred (or is pending), Civil Defence broadcast information through pre-determined networks and may call on the Community Response Group to assist in sharing information or alerting residents.</p>
<p>Local Emergency Services</p>	<p>Our community is supported by the local emergency services. The role of emergency services is as first responder to ‘111’ risk to life; risk to property calls.</p> <p>They respond to a range of incidents, including fires, civil unrest, chemical spills, medical emergencies and motor vehicle accidents. They search for and rescue missing people and deal with dangerous substances, weather events and natural disasters.</p> <p>In a natural disaster, emergency services may delegate tasks to the Community Response Group as an extra resource to support our community.</p>
<p>Community Response Group and Plan</p>	<p>The Community Response Group consists of volunteer responders, representing residents within our community. The Group own the Community Response Plan – helping our residents prepare to deal with hazards and natural disasters. The plan holds information on available local resources, local skills, vulnerable residents, contact lists, alerting and communication options, to assist in a civil emergency. The Group is responsible for setting up Community Led Centres (CLC) that supports the welfare of people, coordinates local resources, communicates information, support displaced residents and visitors (with shelter and food), and assist vulnerable members of their community. The Community Response Group provides an additional resource for emergency services to undertake welfare duties to support</p>

of their community. The Community Response Group is a vital communication link for the EOC to ensure reliable information is shared to and from the community.

# Onemana Tsunami Evacuation

## Where will you go?

**SAFE ZONE**

### Safe Zone

The white shaded areas are 20 or more metres above sea level and are the safe evacuation zones.

Walk to the white hatched areas when you feel the natural warning signs or are officially instructed to evacuate.

**Do not rely on the tsunami siren as your only form of warning.**

- Evacuate immediately. Waves can arrive in minutes or take over an hour.
- Take a go bag with enough supplies in case you can't get home for seven days.



### Local source tsunami

If you are on the coast and experience any of the following natural warning signs:

- Feel an earthquake that lasts longer than a minute or is strong enough to knock you off your feet
- See a sudden rise or fall in sea level or hear loud and unusual sounds from the sea
- Move immediately to the nearest high ground or move inland as far as you can

### Tsunami siren

Single tone sounds continuously for 10 minutes

If you are in a coastal area prepare to evacuate immediately. Check radio updates and Red Cross Hazard app alerts. If you're told to evacuate, go as far up and inland as you can. Keep listening to your local radio station for updates until you are advised to return.

**If it's long, strong, be gone**

### Distant source tsunami

These are made by very strong earthquakes on the other side of the ocean. You will know they are coming because Civil Defence will send public messages out telling you what you need to do, so there's no need to panic.

**If it's far away, you've got all day**

## Evacuation routes

### IMPORTANT

If your property has easy access at the rear (up-hill) to high ground (+20 metres) This should be your preferred escape route – especially in time critical events (e.g. where earthquake epicentre is in close proximity).

**BEWARE OF** dislodged and loose boulders and trees likely to fall or slip following an earthquake.

### Personnel

Command Team, Area and Street Representative, Emergency and Medical, Helpers

#### Roles

Command team - oversee all activities and actions. Liaise with TCDC EMU and emergency services as required. Located at Onemana Fire Station or Central location.

Designated Area and Street Representatives and Helpers – provision of communications to residents, property checks to identify injury or property damage along with providing assembly locations.

Emergency and Medical – enabling rescue, transportation and medical assistance.

Helpers – providing human resource to enable rescues and or providing assistance when and where required.

### Equipment

Primary - Radios, Cellphones, Generators, Loud Hailers, Batteries, Torches, Lanterns, Medical Kits, Spray Paint, Helicopter access

Secondary – Blankets, Water, Food, Transport, Shelter, Rope, Tents

### Actions

**Onemana’s disaster response sits under two categories - Pre and Post Alerts. Pre is applied when notification is available of a pending disaster. Post is applied once a disaster has occurred . The plan identified the potential disaster events hence a response has been developed for each – obviously some actions are repeated.**

### General Response

Pre- Temporary Command Centre to be activated so that alert warnings can be coordinated. Appropriate action to be applied depending on the alert event.
