Pressure is however mounting all along the Eastern Seaboard as the communities are concerned that their voices are not being heard on lots of issues and there is a need for a more focused and localised approach to council spending.

A few continuing issues which we need to remember

- It may be wet now but the westerly winds forecast for summer and dry east coast conditions mean the fire risk will be significant. Please be careful and no open fires or fireworks.
- COVID is still very much in our community so look out for yourself and your neighbours
- Be sensible when swimming as the sand has been shifting around a lot this year with the easterly swells and the rips may and do move. Ask the life guards and swim between the flags
- Please try and protect the sand dunes. The beach and the plantings have been ripped apart a number of times this year and are just starting to rebuild.
- Dogs and dotterals no more need to be said
- Please keep your speed down. There will be a lot more children in the community and as we have no pedestrian
  crossing, where they cross can be a random event especially if they have ice cream or sweets or a swim on
  their minds.



If you haven't been down for awhile there is a new rubbish system and the red bin with general rubbish won't be collected without a tag. Blue bags won't be collected at all but if you still have some they can be taken to the refuse transfer centre.





You may not be aware but we do have a shared community patrol with Whangamata and a number of our people share this responsibility. Thank you all. Like all these things it is a thankless task, so if you see them cruising around give them a wave of support.
